TEACHER LICENSURE PROGRAMS

Since college personnel supervise the student teaching component, students must reside within 200 miles of campus.

TRANSFER

MILITARY

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Our coed graduate programs follow a distance, cohort format. Some programs may require limited time on campus.

Master of Leadership Development is a one-year program exploring creativity, culture, ethical decision-making, leadership identity and critical analysis of research in two focus areas: organizational or not-for-profit leadership.

The Master of Arts in Art Therapy integrates theories of artistic expression within a therapeutic relationship to address physical, psychological, cognitive and social needs of individuals.

The Master of Arts in Music Therapy broadens the current understanding of the therapeutic uses of music. Emphasis is given to understanding and applying theories of music therapy, counseling and psychopathology, and to developing the therapeutic self.
